The project “Developing capacities together: European CSO-university networks for global learning on migration, security and sustainable development in an interdependent world” (InterCap) EuropeAid “is a 3-year project (from Nov. 2017 to Oct. 2020) funded by EuropeAid envisaging to address the emerging concern on the way in which shifting public perceptions of (in) security and risk, influence understanding of migration, sustainable development, roles, responsibilities and lifestyles of EU citizens in an interdependent world.

THE CONTEXT & PRIORITIES

Terrorism and extremist ideology as a challenge to security has significantly increased at a global scale. A large number of EU citizens, who share this view, negatively influence the promotion of further collaboration among the EU and the developing countries, constituting also an obstacle to the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

The Action’s primary aim is to establish European CSOs-university networks, to build the capacities of the education actors, to promote global learning on migration, security and sustainable development in an interdependent world.

PARTNERSHIP

InterCap brings together 13 organizations from 12 different EU countries specialized in teachers’ training, educational reform, sustainable development and migration issues, along with more than 50 associates from all over EU (local authorities, Ministries, Universities, and CSOs).

AUDIT COMPLETED!

Audit on migration, sustainability and development education in the frame of InterCap has been finalized in 12 EU Member States and at EU level, where complex methodology was applied. The objectives of the audit were to identify the conceptual links between international migration and other global processes, including sustainable development at national level; indicate gaps within public understanding of migration as well as sustainable development; conceptualise challenges and ways by which development education could be used as an instrument to raise public awareness in national context on asylum, migration and integration issues.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY OF THE AUDIT REPORT FOR STAKEHOLDERS AND DECISION MAKERS

The Executive summary provides a synthesised overview of the 1st InterCap project activity, where complex analysis was carried out: from 13 national/regional reports on migration, sustainability and development education to EU level analysis on Agenda 2030, Sustainable Development Goals and other relevant documents that reflects asylum, migration and migrant integration processes.

TRANSNATIONAL REPORT ON MIGRATION, SUSTAINABILITY AND DEVELOPMENT EDUCATION

This report is a part of the project InterCap, which aims to improve critical understanding of migration within the context of sustainable development in general and the SDGs in particular. It includes the cases of the partner countries participating in the project: Austria, Bulgaria, Croatia, Cyprus, Germany, Greece, Italy, Lithuania, Malta, Poland, Slovenia, and United Kingdom.

The compiled report encompasses 13 national reports, the EU audit report, a transnational audit report and an executive summary for decision makers. Each partner realised national reports, comprising a state of the art research (literature review) and field work (focus groups and / or expert interviews).

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PIRMOJI „INTERCAP“ KONFERENCIJA LIETUVOJE: ĮGYVENDINTA!

Vilniuje įvyko pirmoji projekto „InterCap“ metinė tarptautinė [konferencija](#) „INTERNATIONAL MIGRATION, SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT AND DEVELOPMENT EDUCATION: WAYS FORWARD“. Vilniaus Universitete 2018 m. spalio 12 d. vykusią konferenciją organizavo „Diversity Development Group“ kartu su projekto partneriais ir asocijuotaisiais partneriais: „Šiaurės ministrų tarybos biuru Lietuvoje“ ir „Vilniaus Universitetu“. Konferencijoje buvo nagrinėjamas didėjantis susirūpinimas dėl to, kaip visuomenės (ne)saugumas daro įtaką suvokimui apie tarptautinę migraciją bei formuoja nedraugišką viešą ir politinį diskursą prieglobsčio, migracijos ir integracijos klausimais.

Konferencijoje susirinko daugiau nei 60 dalyvių: švietimo sistemos atstovai, politikos formuotojai, valstybės tarnautojai, vietos švietimo įstaigų atstovai, mokytojai, būsimieji mokytojai ir kiti dalyviai. Konferenciją sudarė dvi dalys: pranešimai, kuriuos skaitė penki ekspertai iš užsienio ir seminarai. Pranešimų metu ir praktiniuose užsiėmimuose konferencijos dalyviai diskutavo apie darnaus vystymosi tikslus, tarptautinę migraciją ir nelygybės mažinimo politikas.

PCD NETWORK OPENED IN LITHUANIA

The National Network on promoting Policy Coherence for Development (PCD) of Lithuania will unite Lithuanian education actors as well as their knowledge and experience. Collective expertise will be shared with focus on migration and development interdependencies.

Every national network in 12 EU countries consists of 30 members who will regularly share their knowledge and information on virtual platform and *face-to-face* meetings. The platform also allows using virtual library where documents and other related resources are available.
